Diane has asked me to advise all the holiday makers that the question of 'Holiday Insurance' has been raised; should you take out cover or, not bother, which is what the majority do.

Diane has looked into the matter and passed to me the following, please take a look at it, give it some thought and then contact Diane if you feel you should do something about it.

"It has been brought to our attention that it would be very beneficial to have Holiday Insurance in the future. We have always thought it unnecessary for our low cost UK holidays but, from information received, if you are ill or injured whilst away and need a long stay in hospital the insurance would not cover for the provision of a Private Ambulance to repatriate you to the nearest hospital to your home.

Do not think the NHS will arrange this—they will not and it could cost 'an arm and a leg' to get you back home.

In tragic circumstances, e.g. death whilst away, it would probably cost thousands of pounds to provide a special ambulance to return you to your local funeral parlour.

Diane has been advised that the Holiday Insurance would cost about £10.00, which is not a lot to ensure peace of mind.

If you are already covered you will not need it; we certainly hope you won't.

Taking out insurance obviously remains an option, think about it!



A brief insight into what you can expect to see at the following attractions: -

25th April- - - Oakham Treasurer's, Portbury.....£11.00

Oakham Treasurer's is just off the M5 near Junction 19. It comprises a demonstration of man's passion for collecting things, items that were once quite commonplace. Attractions include 'old' Grocer, Sweet, Hardware, Haberdashery and Chemist Shops, plus an Off-licence & Tobacconists; and a lot of Farm Machinery.

They have a large café that should more than suit your gastronomic requirements.

21st May---- Beer Caves & Seaton.....£13.50

Beer Caves are between Lyme Regis and Sidmouth.

This complex of vast man-made underground caverns was created through centuries of quarrying the famous 'Beer Stone'. It was used to build many of our cathedrals, e.g. Exeter, St. Pauls, parts of Westminster Abbey, etc.

Seaton is a town just along the coast from Beer, and is known as the gateway to the Jurassic Coast. There is also a Heritage Tramways that operates between Seaton and Colyton passing through nature reserves in the valley of the River Axe.




