

The buses are wonderful; warm, comfortable, with wifi and usb points and they run very regularly. In Brighton we walked around 'The Lanes' admiring the diamonds we couldn't afford and, after a break in Wetherspoons and a look at the Pavilion, explored the famous pier before catching a bus back. On Wednesday we woke up to see snow on the ground, but it soon cleared up and after breakfast we set off on our planned walk to Beachy Head. It got colder and windier as we got higher and some snow was still on the ground but we soldiered on to reach the Visitor's Centre which was closed. Fortunately there was a cosy pub next door where we could get warm before the muddy trek back.

We had a a look around the De La Warr Pavilion but unfortunately there wasn't much to see, they seemed to be in between exhibitions. It was very cold so we found the local Wetherspoons - The Picture Playhouse which is a restored 1920s cinema and deserves a mention for its amazing decor. After a quick look around the shops we caught the bus back to the nice warm hotel.

Thank you Brenda and Diane for all your hard work in organising the holiday and making sure we had good weather. We would definitely like to return to Eastbourne some time as there is so much we didn't have time to see.



Member Contributions Part 2

Somerset Churches 8

Mark's crowning glory - when the village was a prosperous centre of the wool trade - is the large and very splendid Parish Church of the Holy Cross which dates back to the 12th century. The tower was not built until the 15th century. During this time, it grew in size and splendour, being enlarged and beatified by the craftsmen directed by the Abbots of Glastonbury over successive centuries, also much embellished by the Parishioners. In the late 1800s a gift was made of four finely carved figures of the four Evangelists carved in 1524. by a Belgian wood carver, they were originally in the cathedral of St. Saviours in Bruges.

The nave barrel roof, which from 1754 until 1903 was plastered, is adorned with many heads of abbots, saints, kings, queens and bishops most dating from the 14th century. Above the Choir Vestry door is the Royal Charles 11 Cipher. They were placed in many churches throughout the country following the Restoration of the Monarchy. The tower contains a peal of 8 bells, said to be one of the finest in the Diocese. The 1 ton tenor bell is reputed to be one of the best bells cast by the famous Somerset Bell-founder Bilbie and dates from 1727. The church clock was installed to celebrate the jubilee of Queen Victoria in 1887.

It is said the most beautiful part of the village, Jubilee Green is still known as the Abbot's Causeway. It was down the Mark Yeo River cut by the monks of Glastonbury in the 15th century, that the Abbot and all of his entourage used to travel in his "state" barge for the purpose of visiting his estates, collecting his dues. A beautiful church well loved.

Allerton Church has been at the centre of the village for over 950 years. There has probably been a Saxon settlement here since the 7th

Century. The original name for the village was Alwardition, after Aylward, Abbot of Glastonbury from 1027 to 1053. It was him who built the first chapel here shortly before the Norman Conquest, but churches of that period were built of wood, and no traces remain. The first stone church was built around 1200. This building now forms the present nave, at some stage in the 15th century a chancel was added but little was altered until 1638 when major restoration took place with larger windows in the nave. On the south wall of the nave is a fine stained glass window memorial to the three men of Allerton killed in the First World War; probably made by the William Morris Company of London. There are three yew trees in the churchyard, the oldest estimated to be at least 500 years old.

The church at Badgworth is the only one in the country dedicated to St. Congar, to put it mildly not one of the better known saints. It seems that he was born in Pembrokeshire in about 470 AD. He moved from Wales to Congresbury (named after him) and established a monastery on Cadbury Hill. The North Chancel is believed to be the oldest part of the church, the east window is very early decorated about 1340. A similar one existed at the west end. The Founders Tomb on the North side bears an inscription in Norman French, Jon de Hamton. gist: ici. De Salme. eit. merci. (Jon de Hamton lies here God, on his soul have mercy). On one wall there's an interesting brass tablet placed there by family and friends to commemorate the lives of three local men from the village who lost their lives to typhoid in Pretoria and Johannesburg during the South African Boer wars of 1899-1902. Much has been changed over the centuries built and rebuilt. The tower contains 5 bells, two of them pre-reformation. The organ was originally made for the Prince Regent's Chapel at Brighton in about 1837.

That's about all I have to say, we're off to Ollie's for lunch.....


