The house itself which was built in 1280. It stayed in the Warre family for almost





Walking Group at Chilton Polden

What better way to celebrate Carole's birthday, than a 3 mile walk around the countryside at Chilton Polden. It was Good Friday and the weather was glorious.

Halfway round, we met up with another group of very inquisitive walkers, one of whom I nearly got to, eat out of my hand!

Apart from the discarded umbrella, the unwanted washing machine and the long time dead rat, the rest of the views were exceptional.

Lunch was taken, not in the local pub, but sitting in a field in the sunshine, Audrey, surprised us all by passing round buttered hot cross buns and a special cake for Carole ... well done Audrey!!

Churches 13

Our first stop was the little village of Fiddington, some 5mls west of Bridgwater. It's been a religious site for nearly one thousand years. The present church was first recorded in 1272 AD. By the 14th century it was dedicated to St. Martin of Tours (he was a Roman Centurion and later became a Bishop in France. He was also the patron saint of beggars because he once cut half of his uniform and gave it to someone who had none). Inside the church there's several things of interest; the font is medieval, the pulpit is of Jacobean origin and several of the bench ends have carvings showing fruit and flowers. Behind the altar is a magnificent stain glass window depicting the crucifixion of Jesus. The bell tower contains 6 bells one being from the medieval period, cast at the Bristol bell foundry. Outside just to the right of the porch is a pagan carved female figure representing a fertility goddess used to ward off the devil and deter wrong-doers called a Sheela-na-gig. Well worth a visit.

The second visit was to the Anglican Church of St. Mary's at Stringston as churches go it's not very old. Built in the 17th century it replaced an earlier medieval building. It was not until 1980 that it was named after St. Mary the Virgin. The tower which houses 3 medieval bells, was rebuilt in 1765. Also extensive rebuilding in 1879 at the cost to the rector, Sir Alexander Acland-Hood, Mrs Langley St. Albyn and the parish. It was then that the unusual shaped spire was added.

Number three on our tour was to the church of St. Nicholas at Kilton, situated in the foothills of the Quantocks overlooking the Bristol Channel. The grounds have many wild flowers and there's seating to enjoy the sun and lovely views. Decommissioned in 2004, this beautiful rural church was scheduled to become a controlled ruin with the roof removed and the walls capped. Now under private ownership it has been extensively updated for a new era, as a non-denominational Wayfarers Church.

The earliest mention of Kilton was in 873 AD when King Alfred gave the estate to his son Edward. By 1086 AD it had passed to William de Molun, descended with the barony of Dunster, and thence to the Luttrell family. The church was certainly founded by 1100 AD. Extensive restoration of the church occurred in 1863. The windows of the nave show evidence of Saxon and Norman eras.

If you would like to visit any of the these churches, take my advice, don't use the narrow lanes try and use the A39 to Nether Stowey or the main road through Cannington. As we got caught trying to pass a council waste lorry followed by a very large tractor and trailor, impossible to pass, not very good trying to reverse 6 cars into a field gateway.

Still it all came good in the end, we made our way to the Cottage Inn at Keenthorne where we had lunch and celebrated the birthday of Mrs Jean Burton, and a lovely birthday cake baked by Denise.
