Slinky Bus

Some info regarding the slinky bus!!

Forms and Leaflets available in U3A

What is Slinky?

Slinky is a door-to-door demand-responsive transport service funded by Somerset Council for people not served by or unable to access conventional transport. All the vehicles are accessible.

The service can be used for various purposes including; getting to local health appointments or exercise classes, visiting friends or family, going shopping or attending social events. You can also use the Slinky as a link to other forms of public transport.

Who can use the Slinky?

You will be eligible to use the Slinky bus if you:

Do not have access to public bus service,

Do not have your own transport; or

Have a disability which means you are unable to access a public bus

The service is available to all eligible passengers which could include parents with young children, teenagers, students, the elderly, the retired and people with disabilities.

If you are eligible you will first need to register as a member of the scheme. You must fill in a registration form and return it to the booking office before you use the service for the first time.

You can then book a journey by contacting your booking office at least 24 hours before you want to travel. Trips can be booked up to

two weeks in advance.

For journeys up to 3 miles

Single: £2.50 Return: £4

For journeys over 3 miles

Single: £3.50 Return: £5

There is a 50% fare for English National Concessionary Travel Scheme (https://www.somerset.gov.uk/roads-travel-and-parking/concessionary-bus-passes/) passes on all SLINKY services within Somerset. Concessionary Pass Holders and children aged between 5-16 will be entitled to a 50% reduction in the cost of the fare. Children under 5 travel free.

You will need to show your pass every time you travel.

Only four of us on the 19th so we enjoyed a pleasant and uneventful stroll from Apex Park, along the river bank and sea front to the Bay Café for a drink. We returned through Steart Avenue and Marine Drive.

Summer arrived at the end of May and we took advantage of it with a trip to Steart Marshes. Not a cloud in the sky but a pleasant breeze so the temperature was just right for strolling. Wild flowers everywhere, flag iris, buttercups, cow parsley, elder flower, dog rose and one we had not seen before. Luckily Bernie has a gizmo on his phone and it was identified as possibly an oak leaf hydrangea. There is a native wild hydrangea so it may have been that. There was plenty of bird song but I think we make too much noise to for them the venture out of cover, though we did see a flight of very white, dark headed, ducks.
