Churches 28

Our first visit today was to the village of Goathurst. The Quantocks are blessed with some of the most beautiful churches and Saint Edwards is certainly one of the most interesting. The church's dedication is unusual, to Saint Edward, King and Martyr. This young Saxon King was murdered by his stepmother Elfrida in AD978 at Corfe Castle in Dorset in order that her own son would become King. This suggests that there was a church on this site before the Norman Conquest.

The present building is mainly of the Perpendicular period and dates from the later part of the 15th Century. The tower is older and was built in the 14th century, as it is a simple construction with rich mouldings around the archway. The church was much restored in Victorian times. On the belfry wall under the tower there is a fine collection of Hatchments commemorating the Kemeys-Tynte family of Halswell House. Much of what you see in the church tells something of the people who worshipped here. The Halswell Chaple on the north side of the chancel contains a monument to Sir Nicholas Halswell and his wife Bridget; their effigies are surrounded by kneeling figures of their 9 children, 6 sons and 3 daughters. Well worth a visit.

Unlike Goathurst which occupies the fringes of the Quantocks, Broomfield has a high exposed situation being the highest village in the Quantock Hills. The church of Saint Mary's and All Saints is an interesting building. There's been a place of worship here on the present church site since at least 11th Century. The tower was added around AD1440 and is similar in style to Saint George's church in Dunster. It originally contained 5 bells all cast during the 18th/19th centure.

ries by different makers. They fell into disuse in AD1928 and were not heard again until AD1990 when they were restored.

During a further major rebuilding in the 16th Century, the north aisle was added. Broomfield was noted in the Domesday Book (1086) as Brunfelle; it has always been a very widespread community. In AD1259 a charter was granted to the Lord of the Manor by King Henry 3rd for an annual fair to be held on the 13th November but was discontinued in the 1890's. Inside the church there remain almost unaltered one of the richest and most complete series of bench ends and seats in the country carved by Simon Werman 500 years ago; many depict fishes and pointed leaf designs. The wagon roofs of the nave and aisle are medieval in date and style. There are angels holding shields across their chests and the bosses are of a carved leaf design. Lastly above the south door are the Royal Arms of Queen Anne dated AD1714. Restored in the 1980's, it is carved in lime wood and thought to be one of only two left in the country. A beautiful building.
