I turned back after ¾ of a mile leaving the younger, fitter


group to go on to Hackness Sluice. They made it, as the picture of "The Boys" proves.



Finally, it's over! — peace reigns yet again — no more of this *racket* coming from that little black box which sits in the corner of the lounge, as the leafy suburb of London known as Wimbledon, once again, returns to normal.

I recall many years ago, I met this beautiful young tennis player, and she was *ace*, I tell you! She was also absolutely besotted with the game, she was always in the centre of the court, *A nnette* was her name. Sadly nothing ever came of us as a couple because to her, *love* meant nothing!

An interesting fact that I learnt only a week ago, and that is, most players from America, either live in or were born in the state of *Tenness-ee*

I did watch a bit of it this year on the television, and it struck me, that you know when a match involving a British player ends, when it's **Wimble-done**

What surprises me is, nowadays a lot of these matches go on until late in the evening. I had always assumed that the players went to bed around *ten-ish*

A friend of mine was telling me a little while ago, that his wife was complaining to him as he had already told her 14 jokes about tennis. He responded by saying, "Right now, I'm telling you joke **15-love**" Following *that* conversation, she informed him that she was divorcing him and would see him in *court*. I empathised with him, but thought

to myself that this would *serve* him right, as she clearly had the *advantage*.

I really wish they would change the scoring system though, but the tennis world seems to be **set** in it's ways and does not see the **point** in changing anything. For the hierarchy, I suppose they feel it's just not worth changing, as it's only a **game**!

Talking of the scoring system, I was amazed recently about the number of people that I had spoken too, who did not know why the scoring system should be 15, 30, 40 etc. and not, as you would expect, 1, 2, 3 etc. Let me explain.

The modern game of tennis (also known as 'Lawn Tennis') was invented by a chap called Major Walter Copton Wingfield in 1873, although the game itself, can be dated back to the middle ages, a time well before any sound system, but they still needed to let the spectators know the current score. This was achieved by using two very large clock faces, strategically placed on the court, with each being marked 0 to 60 (one for each player) so as to make sure that the score could be seen from a distance, so there could be no misinterpretation and to avoid any confusion.

When a player scored their first point, the hand on the clock face was physically moved a quarter of the way round to15. With the second point being scored, it then went onto the next quarter to 30, followed by another to 45 and in those days, a win was when one player reached 60.

But hang on, I hear you say, the scoring is 15, 30 & 40 and NOT 45! – so what happened? Well, when tennis became more popular and sound systems were in their infancy, it was felt that to say the words 'forty five' (which has three syllables), it took too long to pronounce, so they truncated it down to 40 to match the two previous two syllable score words of fifteen and thirty.

While I'm at it, I will explain why the word 'love' is used as a score instead of saying 'nil' or even 'nothing'. When written, zero is shown as an '0' which resembles the shape of an egg. The French word for egg is 'l'oeuf', the pronunciation being not too dissimilar to the English word 'love'.

Finally, we hear the word 'deuce'. This word is used when both players have scored three points each, ie 40-40. But to win the game, one player then needs to win two more points in succession. The French word for two games, (or in our case two points) is 'deux de jeux' which I suppose, can sound a bit like 'deuce'.

And there we have it!

I recall going to Wimbledon once, a few years ago now. I was very impressed with the *service* I got from all the staff there. It was during the John McEnroe era. They used to say that, at home, he never changed a light bulb, because he refused to admit that it had gone out!

PS Look out for our next magazine folks, I can't wait! I will be delving into the exciting game of rugby, when I will **try** to explain the rules relating to this appealing and absorbing sport!....."eerr sorry, what did you say?....Oh, I see. yes, OK I understand, I'll just forget that then!
